

Galbraith-Wardman Fellowship for 2018

In 1994 John and Rosemary Galbraith started an endowment for a fellowship that supports one Eckerd student, either a rising junior (current sophomore) or rising senior (current Junior), to participate in a research project at the Bermuda Institute of Ocean Sciences (BIOS) over the summer. In 2014, the Wardman family provided the additional support needed to continue this unique opportunity in the face of rising costs.



The internship pays travel to Bermuda, all expenses associated with a 10-week research experience with a member of the faculty of the Bermuda Institute of Ocean Sciences (BIOS), plus a stipend of \$2000.00.

Applicants should email to Professor Siuda a brief statement of research interests, unofficial transcripts, one letter of recommendation from a faculty member (other than Brooks, Krediet, Meylan, Siuda or Szelistowski) and an up-to-date C.V. on or before 31 March 2018. Applications from well-qualified Eckerd students will be sent on to BIOS. The final selection is made by BIOS faculty and will depend in part on matching interests of the intern with the interests of faculty at BIOS. Therefore it will be necessary for applicants to familiarize themselves with the research programs of the BIOS faculty by using the mentor/project list developed for this internship for summer 2018. It is available on the BIOS website. Students in all disciplines are encouraged to apply. This fellowship is open only to Eckerd students but its existence does not exclude Eckerd students from consideration for other BIOS internship programs.
